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What We Do

TrustedRiders provides a low-cost service solution: Deploying Certified Chaperones as temporary compassionate companions.

- Bridging a longstanding gap in transportation between the curb and the door with door-to/throughdoor assistance.
- Making ANY available transportation ACCESSIBLE and safe: rideshare, volunteer drivers, vans, public transportation, paratransit, and taxis.



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Who Chaperones Help



- Helping vulnerable people get to non-emergency medical and other essential services
- Serving anyone needing or wanting a physically present helping hand and advocate
- Escorting people discharged from procedures requiring sedation or infusion, requiring a responsible adult named prior to the procedure, required by insurance

What TrustedRiders Chaperones Do





- Chaperones (range from age 18 to retirees): Meet their client at their front door or inside the residence, assist the client to the vehicle, accompany the client to the destination, and escort the client safely home.
- Act as the "responsible adult" mandated by protocols and insurance for any patient discharged from procedures requiring sedation.
- Make appointment reminders and wellness calls to assist the patient.
- · Support telemedicine visits at the patient's home.
- · Help to smooth the process for discharge planners.
- Assist patients in appointments, with HIPAA compliance.
- Provide comprehensive "wrap-around" support critical to older neighbors, adults with disabilities, overburdened family caregivers, and long-distance family members.

What is the community benefit?



- Adds missing element of door through door
- Increases probability consumers will make scheduled appointment
- Increases probability that consumers will fill prescriptions
 Both factors help reduce hospitalization risk
 - Decreases consumer and caregiver anxiety
 - Decreases social isolation for volunteer and consumer
